Year 4 History Trip ~ Windsor Castle
Friday 23rd January 2026

Year 4 will be learning about Medieval Britain in the spring term, and will be visiting Windsor Castle to enhance what they have already learnt about life in these times. This trip provides the children with opportunity to experience life in a Royal Castle.

They will be looking at the following during their visit;

If you do not do this you will need to supply your own packed lunch for the trip. There is a no rubbish policy at Windsor Castle so packaging and food wastage will be brought home.

The cost of the outing will be **£16.40** per child and therefore we are requesting this as a voluntary contribution. Please can we request that voluntary payment for this trip be made via Parent Pay. Please do not send in cash or cheques; this payment will be set up on your Parent Pay account. We would ask that payment is made as soon as possible and by the latest **9am Monday 1st December 2025**. If you do not currently hold a Parent Pay account, please visit the school office so that we can reissue you with a letter containing your login details.

Requesting financial contributions for educational visits

School Trips – Voluntary Contributions

It has been brought to the schools attention that perhaps some parents are unsure why schools ask for a voluntary contribution but then contact parents when they have not contributed. Our letters are written in a way that does not exclude a child because a parent is unable or unwilling to pay for a trip. Below is an explanation as to why we promote school trips but also why we ask for voluntary contributions.

The value and importance of educational visit:

Learning outside the classroom is widely recognised as a valuable and effective means of extending pupil knowledge, enriching pupil understanding, and promoting personal and social development. Ofsted also acknowledge the importance of quality learning experiences outside the classroom for raising pupil attainment. Consequently, this school promotes and encourages the organisation of educational visits for all its pupils, and it is hoped that parents will also recognise the value and importance of these visits, and give their full support.

Cost of the Visit:

The school believes wholeheartedly in the value of these experiences, and subsidises the cost of all visits as much as possible in an attempt to ensure that these opportunities are accessible and affordable to all. However, the school seldom has the financial resources to pay the full costs. Consequently, a voluntary contribution is normally requested from parents/guardians to make up the shortfall. This contribution is genuinely voluntary, and neither you nor your child will be treated differently if you are unable or choose not to contribute. However, please note that without all such voluntary contributions, visits may have to be cancelled, as the school is not in a position to provide further financial support.
