

THE SEASONS ASSEMBLY SCRIPT – YEAR 1 ROBINS

Opening scene

- Narrators 1–8
- Speakers 1–3
- Sun
- Earth

Autumn Group – Tree, Wind, Hedgehog, Squirrel, Farmer

Winter Group – Snow Cloud, Snowflake, Bear, Robin, Child in Coat

Spring Group – Flower, Bee, Chick, Rain Cloud

Summer Group – Sun Hat Child, Ice Cream, Butterfly, Summer Tree

OPENING SCENE – THE SUN

(Sun stands still centre stage. Earth slowly walks in a circle around the Sun. Narrators walk on.)

Narrator 1 *(touches Sun, jumps back)*

“Ouch! Owwww! Hot! Hot! HOT!”

Narrator 2

“Careful! That’s the Sun — a giant ball of very, very hot gas! We must never touch it or look straight at it.”

(Narrator 1 runs off fanning hand.)

Narrator 3

“Everyone, say hello to our Sun... and our Earth!”

Narrator 4

“As Earth travels around the Sun, it spins at a tilt.”

(Earth tilts slightly while walking)

Narrator 5

“Earth is tilted at an angle of 23.5 degrees.”

Narrator 6

“This tilt gives us our seasons: autumn, winter, spring and summer.”

Narrator 7

“So grab your brollies, scarves, sunhats and sunscreen...”

Narrator 8

“...and let’s explore the seasons!”

(Sun and Earth leave stage.)

AUTUMN

(Autumn group comes on. Windy storm actions from rest of class.)

Narrator 1

“September, October and November are the months of autumn.”

Narrator 2

“Our part of Earth starts to tilt away from the Sun. We get cooler days.”

Narrator 3

“Leaves change colour and fall from trees.”

Narrator 4

“Farmers harvest crops, and animals get ready for winter.”

Narrator 5

“Some animals store food for the colder months.”

Autumn Character Lines

Tree:

“My leaves turn red, yellow and orange... then I let them fall!”

Wind:

“Whooooosh! I blow the leaves off the trees!”

Hedgehog:

“I eat lots of food to get ready for winter.”

Squirrel:

“I hide nuts in the ground to eat later.”

Farmer:

“It’s harvest time! We collect food from the fields.”

Autumn Group Together:

“Autumn is windy, cool and bright!”

(Autumn group leaves.)

WINTER

(Winter group enters. Snow play miming.)

Narrator 6

“December, January and February are winter months.”

Narrator 7

“Our part of Earth is tilted furthest away from the Sun.”

Narrator 8

“We have the shortest days and the least sunlight.”

Narrator 1

“December 21st is called the Winter Solstice. It is the shortest day of the year.”

Narrator 2

“Some animals hibernate. That means they go into a long sleep to save energy.”

Winter Character Lines**Snow Cloud:**

“I bring cold weather and snow!”

Snowflake:

“I fall gently from the sky.”

Bear:

“I hibernate to stay safe and warm.”

Robin:

“My red chest makes me easy to spot in winter.”

Child in Coat:

“I wear a coat, hat and gloves to keep warm.”

Winter Group Together:

“Winter is cold with shorter light!”

(Winter group leaves.)

**SPRING**

(Spring group enters. Lamb jumping and growing actions.)

Narrator 3

“March, April and May are the months of spring.”

Narrator 4

“Our part of Earth starts to tilt towards the Sun again.”

Narrator 5

“The weather gets warmer, but can still be rainy and windy.”

Narrator 6

“Plants grow, flowers bloom, and baby animals are born.”

Spring Character Lines**Flower:**

“I grow and bloom in spring sunshine.”

Bee:

“I collect nectar from flowers to make honey.”

Chick:

“I hatch from my egg in spring!”

Rain Cloud:

“Spring showers help plants grow.”

Spring Group Together:

“Spring brings flowers, babies and rain!”

(Spring group leaves.)

 **SUMMER**

(Summer group enters. Beach actions.)

Narrator 7

“June, July and August are the summer months.”

Narrator 8

“Our part of Earth is tilted towards the Sun the most.”

Narrator 1

“That means longer days and warmer weather.”

Narrator 2

“When it’s sunny, we wear sunscreen and hats to stay safe.”

Summer Character Lines**Sun Hat Child:**

“I wear a hat and sunscreen to protect my skin.”

Ice Cream:

“I melt fast in the summer heat!”

Butterfly:

“I flutter around flowers in warm sunshine.”

Summer Tree:

“I am full of green leaves in summer.”

Summer Group Together:

“Summer brings sunshine back again!”

(Summer group leaves.)

FACT SECTION

Speaker 1:

“When it is summer in the United Kingdom, it is winter in Australia.”

Speaker 2:

“July is usually one of the warmest months in the United Kingdom.”

Speaker 3:

“Winter months are usually the coldest months in the United Kingdom.”

Speaker 1:

“Rain can fall in any season.”

Speaker 2:

“We write autumn, winter, spring and summer without capital letters.”

ENDING

Narrator 1:

“We hope you learned something new about the seasons!”

Narrator 2:

“Thank you for being a wonderful audience!”
