Dear Parents and Carers,

Year 6 Mock SATs Results

On **Friday 27th March**, your child will be sent home with a copy of their **mock SATs results**.

We have made the decision to share these results with you so that you have a clear understanding of how your child is currently performing and can support them at home, particularly in any areas where they may need further development.

The mock SATs taken in March are a practice opportunity, and it is important to remember that there is still plenty of time for your child to make progress and improve before the actual SATs in May. These results simply provide a helpful snapshot of where your child is now and what they need to focus on next.

Please note that the results from assessments are only going to be sent home for Year 6 children – **no other year group will receive their results**. The only results that will be sent home will be the mock SATs results in the Spring term, this will not happen during Autumn term assessments.

What are SATs?

SATs (Standard Assessment Tests) are national assessments taken by all children in Year 6 in May. They assess the knowledge and skills pupils have developed across Year 3-6. This year they will take place from **Monday 11th May 2026 – Thursday 14th May 2026**.

The SATs assess pupils in:

- Reading (one paper)
- Maths (three papers - Arithmetic and two Reasoning)
- Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) (2 papers – Spelling and Grammar and Punctuation)

These tests are used to measure attainment at the end of Key Stage 2, and are reported to both parents and your child's secondary schools.

Understanding the Results

SATs results are reported using **scaled scores**, which typically range from **80 to 120**:

- **100** = Expected standard
- **Below 100** = Working below the expected standard
- **110+** = Working at greater depth (above the expected standard)

Alongside this, you will also see your child's **raw score**. This is the number of marks your child achieved on the test (e.g. 35 out of 50). The raw score is converted into a scale score, which allows results to be compared fairly across the country, as test difficulty can vary slightly each year.



Writing Assessment

You will notice that your child has not received a writing result. This is because writing is assessed differently. There is no SATs test for writing; instead, it is assessed by the teacher using a range of evidence from your child's written work.

There is no obligation for you to share these results with your children. However, if you feel it would motivate and support them, you may wish to discuss them together in a positive and encouraging way.
