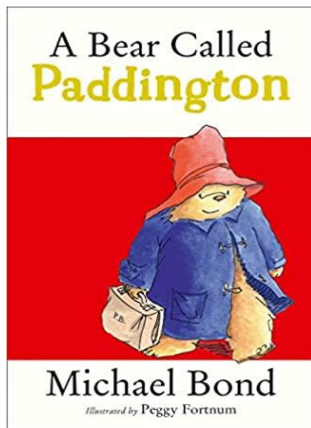

A Bear Called Paddington – Michael Bond

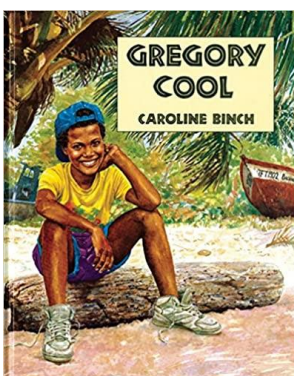
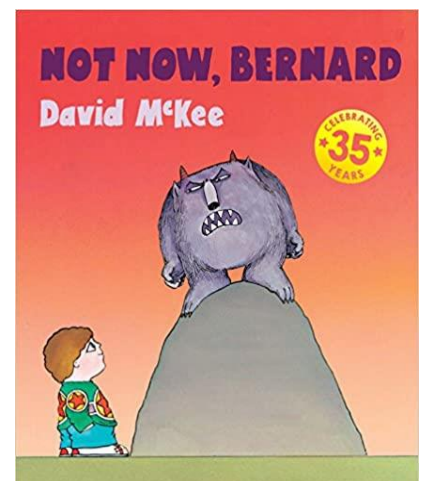

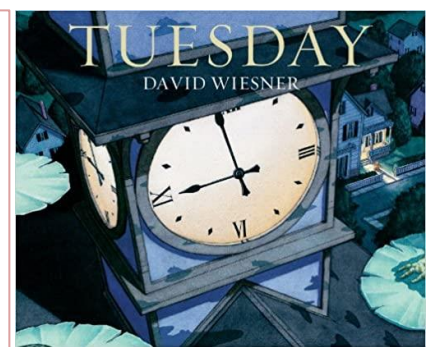
Gregory Cool- Caroline Binch
